The last five weeks we've looked at the area of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment, and how successful schools for young adolescents address these areas. I've included links below in case you've missed any - click on the "Week" in front of each statement.

Week 1 - Educators value young adolescents and are prepared to teach them.

<u>Week 2</u> - Students and teachers are engaged in active, purposeful learning.

<u>Week 3</u> - Curriculum is challenging, exploratory, integrative, and relevant.

Week 4 - Educators use multiple learning and teaching approaches.

Week 5 - Varied and ongoing assessments advance learning as well as measure it.

As a Christian school, we add another distinguishing characteristic of our curriculum that differentiates us from other schools - faith integration. I have hinted at this characteristic in the statements linked above, but wanted to take an extra moment to present the idea of faith integration on its own.

To integrate means that you combine pieces in order to form a whole. The idea of wholeness is essential in Christian education because we look at content as being incomplete without a connection back to our understanding of God - Who He is and what He has done. Just as content in one discipline is connected to content in other areas, making our overall understanding more complete, faith integration argues that wholeness does not happen without the integration of our faith perspective.

- In Math: how our understanding of math principles, numbers, and order give us a clear picture of the nature of God's reliable character.
- In Science: how our study of the different branches of Science reveals to us the intricacy of a creator/designer Who has revealed Himself to us through creation.
- In History: How we can observe the providence of God through the superintending of the affairs of man throughout history, accomplishing His plan and purpose.
- In Literature: how studies of characters in novels provide a narrative on the character and nature of man, both in what we experience everyday and what we long for.

These statements are brief, but provide a quick peek at the way faith integration completes the picture of what we study. Because we hold the Truth and can know it in the written Word of God and through the Son of God, we know that no knowledge is complete without seeing how it fits into the greater picture of knowledge. The wholeness that comes through faith integration is a distinguishing part of our vision of who our students will become, that they would be "persons of Christian vision and influence."
